Ah well that's it for another season I can take a rest now and just bring all my paperwork up to date, or so I thought, I then got talked into doing my (again) last meeting of the year of at of all places Brands Hatch for the Truck Superprix the Idea being that I would surprise my mate Roger (Brands Chief Marshal), so I arranged with Andy McLeod to go down on the Friday meet up with him and Norrie Netzlof who looks after the Truck Paddock and go to Brands first thing Saturday morning which meant being up for 4 o'clock in the morning (yes there are two 4 o'clocks in one day), the original idea was that I was going to go to signing on stood behind Andy and he was going to say he had another Trainee for him to sign on and see what his reaction was when he saw me, unfortunately the accommodation that Norrie had "arranged" didn't work out so I had to ring Roger and ask him to put me up for the Saturday night so the surprise element was not going to happen, however it also backfired on Andy and Norrie as there wasn't a room at the Portabello for them either but the owner who is also one of the Truck Racers arranged alternative accommodation elsewhere which also included a room for me by which time it was to late. When it comes to manning I had for the BTCC about 180 names for 19 posts, Roger had for the Truck Fest 282 names for 14 posts and 400+ for the BTCC on the short Circuit the meeting before, fortunately on all occasions not everyone turned up. As the last time I was at Brands was for the GP in 1982 I expected things to have changed a bit and they certainly had, where we camped in a field next to the Circuit was now a Motorway, the Grandstands and new buildings where impressive but where we signed on in the Hailwood Suite would look good at Croft, the Circuit itself was of course unchanged and I was put in charge of Post 3 the top of Paddock Hill Bend and the point that vehicles seem to go straight on, and they did!, we had apart from the Trucks, Steve Hill and his Legends, Pickups, Mini Se7ens, Miglias and the SE Saloon c/ship, with being on Post 3 I also had to look after the gate on to the Circuit as this was the only place that the trucks could get onto the grid (there could have been a bit of a problem getting them through the tunnel), there was a full grid of 18 trucks and as they went passed me onto the Circuit I disappeared in a cloud of smoke, in fact had I been a smoker I would have had enough of a fix to last me a fortnight, for safety's sake no posts are manned during the Truck racing just as well as in the first practice one went straight on at Druids through the gravel and flattening two layers of Armco which took about 40min to rebuild and in the last race one spun hit the Armco broadside on and wrecked about 40yds of Barrier and Tyre wall but they then had the rest of the week to sort that out. I only had to call for the Safety Car once but apart from two races over the weekend it was required at the rest. I met lots of friends I hadn't seen since Zandvoort, UAE and France as well as Circuits in this country, if I had to moan at all it would be at Andy who was Safety Car/Truck Observer, he gets a big Scania and a BMW M3!! Tony and I get Fiat 500s??. All in all though a very good meeting even if I don't get to go back there until 2038?.

I stayed on at Andy's for a couple of extra days as I wanted to go to Brooklands for a look around, well worth doing as it is a very good museum with cars, bikes and aircraft including the Wellington Bomber they salvaged from Loch Ness which is now almost complete as well as aircraft engines etc, I also went down to the Sammy Miller Motorcycle Museum where there are some 400 exhibits almost all of which have been fully restored, I hadn't realised how many British Manufacturers where developing 3 and 4cyl bikes even older makes like Scott and Villiers as well as BSA and Triumph's, there was also a 5cyl Rotary Piston engine machine from America thought to have



been used in Board Racing??.

It all began with an iPhone..... March was when my son celebrated his 15th birthday, and I got him an iPhone. He just loved it. Who wouldn't




My daughter's birthday was in August so I got her an iPod Touch.
